What does the Clinical Pharmacy service offer?

We are a team of clinical pharmacists providing bespoke services in a variety of community setings supporting general practice, care homes and urgent care services. We deliver a high standard, consistent approach to patients and partners alike tailored to local population needs.

Roles we can offer supporting General Practice include:

- Delivery of dedicated chronic disease management clinics through experienced clinical pharmacists
- Development, support and monitoring of medicines governance procedures such as repeat prescribing
- Management and processing of medication enquiries from patients and healthcare practitioners
- Attendance at care home reviews to rationalise polypharmacy and identify (and support the management of) deteriorating patients
- Completion of medicines reconciliation for patients discharged from other services
- Interface with secondary care, community pharmacies and the CCG to improve pathways between services
- Creative delivery of the CCGs medicines optimisation agenda through specialist pharmacy technicians

In addition to direct services, using our service also allows:

- Access to additional Advanced Specialist Pharmacists in specific disease areas such as mental health, respiratory, falls etc. These pharmacists can be accessed according to your individual practice needs at any given time allowing you to target a variety of chronic disease management.
- The provision of senior management and leadership including in-practice presence to support the pharmacist and broader general practice team.
- Optional annual leave cover avoiding disruption to the service.
- On-going professional training and development.
- Associated governance structures as we recognise these are new roles for general practice.
