You can bring someone with you. However you may be asked to be seen on your own during your appointment.

We will involve family, friends and carers in discussions and care planning only after gaining your approval. We will routinely offer carers support in their own right. Always maintaining confidentiality.

Who is the service for

The Plymouth Assertive Outreach Service (AOS) is a bespoke proactive team approach to helping people of working age, with severe and enduring mental health problems in their own homes. It is used to help support service users who find it difficult to engage with traditional services.

What we aim to offer

The service focuses on working with individuals with complex psychological, social, emotional and medical issues. Our approach is focused on recovery functioning and social inclusion, working with service users and their carers to create care plans which are tailor made to individual need.

Our overall aim is:

- To treat the service user effectively in the community

- Work collaboratively with people towards recovery

- To work alongside people, at their pace, to promote their independence and work with them to improve their quality of life

- Provide a service which de-stigmatises mental health issues

- Reduce length and frequency of hospital admissions
- Provide a holistic approach to assessment and treatment
- Provide a service for as long as the individual requires one
- Welcome service user and carer involvement

All our staff are trained to respect confidentiality. We may need to share information with other people helping you. We will always ask for your permission to do so before sharing. If you are concerned about this please talk to any of our staff.

- Engagement

- Reducing social exclusion and promoting social inclusion
- Identifying, reducing, managing and containing risk
- Police Liaison
- Child Protection Work
- Delivery and administration of medication and treatment to service users who require intensive monitoring
