# Language Concepts

### What are Concepts?

Basic concepts are words that all children need to understand in order to help them access everyday activities in various environments - at home, at school, at the park, or in social situations.

Basic language concepts are also critical to help and support further learning, for example, a child needs to understand **big / little** before they can understand **large, wide, long.** 

### **Examples of Concepts**

Basic colours- red, orange, yellow, green, blue, purple, pink

**Position** - on, off, in, out, under, in front, behind, top, bottom, up, down, inside, outside, high, low

**Directions** -through, around, open, close

Quantities - one, one more, less, more, most, few, many, some

**Sequences** - first, next, after that, and finally, before, after,

Shapes - circle, triangle, square, rectangle, diamond, oval, round

Size - small, large, big, little, huge, tiny

Feelings - happy, sad, mad, angry, silly, surprised

**Textures** - bumpy, rough, smooth, soft, prickly, hard

**Time -** morning, afternoon, evening, late, early, today, tomorrow, week, month, year, day

Descriptions - loud, soft, hot, cold, fast, slow, new, old, empty, full, wet, dry

### **Teaching Concepts**

Talk with your child about everything you see, hear, touch and do!

- Getting dressed comment on the <u>colour</u> of everybody's clothes, if they have <u>patterns</u>, <u>pictures</u>, <u>stripes</u> or <u>spots</u>, which are <u>big</u> and which are <u>little</u>.
- When doing the washing, talk about <u>clean</u> and <u>dirty</u> clothes, <u>wet</u> and <u>dry</u> clothes, tell
  them when you are <u>opening</u> and <u>shutting</u> the door, putting clothes <u>in</u> or taking them
  <u>out</u>.
- When putting the shopping away or at tidy up time, talk about concepts such as <u>in</u>, <u>on</u>, <u>under</u>.



- At the shops, pick up the apple in the fruit section or have your child put it in the bag.
  Direct their attention to what it looks like. "Look, this apple is <u>red</u> and <u>round</u>. It looks like a <u>circle</u>. Feel it. It feels so <u>smooth!</u>"
- While driving, talk about what you see and hear! "Wow, did you hear that motorbike?
   It was <u>loud!</u>" Look at that Lorry, It is <u>big!</u>"
- Talk about the way things look and feel when you are going for a walk.

Remember, Basic Concepts are every-day words that are critical to your child's speech and language development and learning! They are words that you can teach through modelling, talking, reading, playing games and even singing. Start by incorporating a few of these words into your everyday language and use them often!
