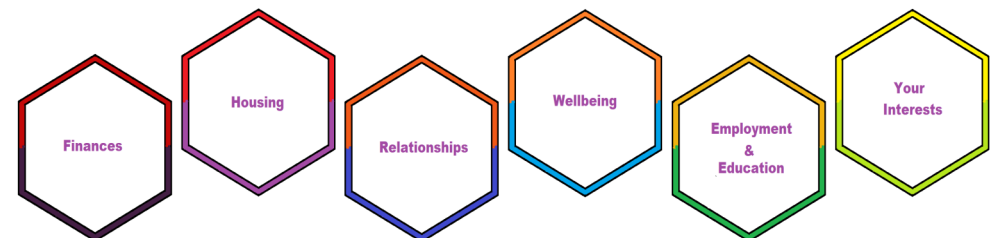

What is P.A.S.S.?

The Plymouth Autism Spectrum Service (P.A.S.S.) provides a dedicated and specialist service for adults with Autism, their families, and Health and Social Care Services. P.A.S.S. collaborates with community organisations within Plymouth.

P.A.S.S. offers three services:

1. Autism assessment
2. Advice and signposting to adults already diagnosed with Autism
3. Specialist Training and Consultation available to Practitioners within adult Livewell Southwest services and relevant adult Plymouth City Council services. Email us details with your query: livewell.pass@nhs.net

P.A.S.S. is for people who are aged 18 and over; do not have a diagnosed Learning Disability; are registered with a Plymouth GP.

How Do I Access P.A.S.S.?

If you would like an assessment of Autism you should ask your GP or health/ social care worker to refer you. You cannot self refer for an Autism assessment.

If you have a diagnosis of Autism you can complete a self-referral form and send it to us via post or email. You can find the form on our website <https://www.livewellsouthwest.co.uk>.

Adults who already have diagnosis of Autism will be asked to share written evidence of their diagnosis with P.A.S.S.

What happens when we receive your referral?

If you have asked for an assessment of Autism, and the challenges described suggest an assessment would be helpful, you will be offered a place on the waiting list for assessment.

If you have asked for advice or signposting you or the referrer will be asked to send in confirmation of your diagnosis of Autism. Once we have seen evidence of a diagnosis of Autism then you will be offered an introductory appointment.

If you do not have sufficient evidence of a diagnosis of Autism, we will offer you a place on the waiting list for an assessment.

What happens once my referral is accepted?

If you have asked for an assessment of Autism, we will invite you to an appointment once your referral reaches the top of the waiting list. You will be sent information about the assessment. You can also look at our website.

If you have asked for advice or signposting, you will be given the opportunity to talk about your current experiences and we will develop an action plan to help meet your needs. We will support you to carry out the action plan.

After the initial appointment you can attend P.A.S.S. groups and meet the other staff at P.A.S.S. Once we have met you, P.A.S.S. will be available to you whenever you need support. You will be able to contact us and book an appointment.
