How to request help from our service

If you are concerned about a child in your school or setting, you need to contact us in the first instance to discuss what your concerns are, what the impact is on the child or young person, what you have put in place so far, and how well that has worked. Schools have access to a link therapist for Request for Help discussions.

Please ensure that you have consent from the child's parent/carer to discuss the child with us.

We may make some further suggestions or signpost you to additional sources of support. We may be able to suggest some additional training to help you support the child or young person in class.

If we feel that some direct assessment or intervention from the service is required, we will add the child to our waiting list for assessment.
