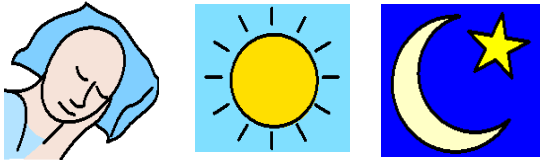

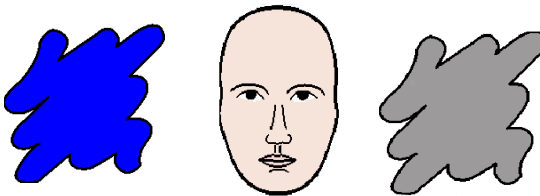
### What does dying look like?

Eating and drinking less

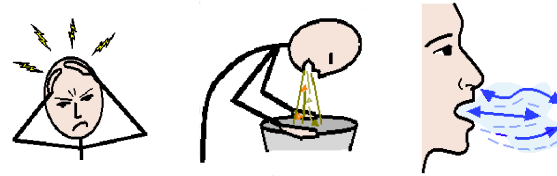


Skin may change colour

In pain, being sick or difficulties breathing

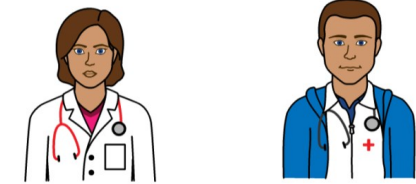
### Medicines



Medicine can help make the person feel comfortable.

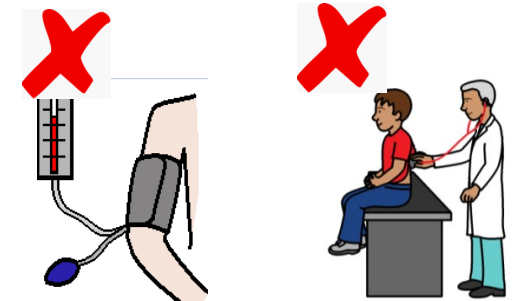
Tablets, injections or patches can be given.

### Appointments and Tests



The doctors and nurses will try to stop the pain or stop the sickness.

'Just in case' medicines can be given by the doctor or nurse



They will not do any more blood tests, take their temperature or blood pressure
