Transport that patients can use :

Forms of transport that patients can use to attend medical appointments.

Ambulance Transport

Eligibility Criteria:

- Patients unable to use any other form of standard transport.
- Patients with mobility issues
- Patients who need additional medical support on the journey.

Dial a Ride

Is a door-to-door transport service for Plymouth residents who are eligible for a bus pass but struggle to access the bus service.

This service operates Monday to Friday 9.15am to 4.15pm.

Can be booked 1 week in advance, bookings need to be booked in before 2pm.

The service has 2 spare wheelchairs for patients to us.

Return trip is free of charge.

1-2 miles £6.00

3-4 miles £8.00

5-8 miles £13

Carers can accompany patient for £3.00.

Norton Brook Patient Transport Service

Provide a transport service for patients who are registered at Norton Brook Medical Centre. The service will provide transport to and from the medical centre, South Hams Hospital, and other services within the Kingsbridge area.

There is an answerphone for out of hour queries.

Clients will need to give 2-3 days' notice and there is no set charge, but the service does ask for a donation towards the cost of the driver's fuel expenses.

Public Transport

The Orthotic clinic is near a major bus route. The 2 buses are the 23 and 24 bus, which are

regular throughout the day.

At Derriford there are several bus services that go to Derriford Hospital

Patients with disabilities and a bus pass may be entitled to a 'companion pass' this is free travel to someone who is accompanying you to your medical appointment.

Taxi

Taxi drivers have a legal duty to help passengers in and out of their vehicle (unless medically exempt) and making sure wheelchairs are secured safely.
